The agenda was unanimously approved as distributed. We don't have previous minutes to approve.

District person in charge retired and new person hasn't yet finalized everything. We don't have a budget yet. Salary is difficult to sustain. Site Control: no approval needed (paper, towels, etc) Covid Fund: no longer available LCFF/LCAP: state money that districts make budgets from. Unduplicated students (foster/low income/ELL/etc). VAPA, counselors, social worker, behavior specialists are funded through the district. Social worker (shared with Clearview), funded from district LCAP, and this is the last year the district will fund it, so we need to decide what we want to do about that.

Title 1: solely funded from meal applications and we are missing 16% of applications. Right now we are at 24% low income. We need to be at 40% to maintain Title 1. Fill it out even if don't think they will qualify. Military helps to qualify. We also get credit for percentage of applications turned in as well! 35%-39% is partial Title 1. Title 1 funds do not rollover to the next year. Staff Allocations that the district pays for: Clerical (2 employees at 8 hours/day), Library Clerk (3.5 hours/day), Custodial (2 employees at 8 hours/day and 1 at 3 hours/day and he's shared with Arroyo), Noon Duty (7 hours/day and we pay for additional time), VAPA teachers (2 and then we share with another school to have the 4 that we need). Librarian students will learn to reshelve books!

May revision from governor. So budget is always an estimate We tie our goals to data and that's how we decide where are biggest needs are and how we spend our money.

Min CAASPP data: disparity between all of our students compared to our EL students. These numbers are percentages. We know there are reasons, but we are going to use the data to move forward.

Military students and Students With Disabilities are doing very well.
Urgent need: EL students. Strategically use our money to support English Learners.

ELA: 106 EL students. Only 15% met/were proficient. It is an urgent need to meet the needs of our English learners. We are going to meeting as staff to discuss scaffolds to access the curriculum. We are not doing different curriculum, but rather scaffolds to the curriculum that everyone else is doing. Staff needs to be cognizant that the ELPACA is just as important as the CAASPP. It is a challenging test. They pass the listening/speaking. They struggle with Writing, and sometimes Reading.

Through an equity lens, the Olympic View community is dedicated to working collaboratively to ensure ALL students show measurable growth through school-wide, common assessments in reading. This will occur through the implementation of systematic, high impact reading strategies, student leadership, and the use of diverse texts to promote inclusion and whole student well-being.

Our Wildly Important Goal:

All OV students will make a 1 year growth in reading by June 2023 as measured by Oral Running Records as well as iReady ELA.

Last year's SSC approved \$14K for all the diverse texts that are now in the classrooms. Every classroom got about 25 books (same books throughout every classroom). They are amazing books!

That included the First 8 Days for Leader in Me read aloud books. Different for each grade level.

How do we use our money to support our goals?

Students need to see themselves in books! Autism, Food insecurity, When they read out loud, some understand/comprehend better.

Wildly Important Goal: All students will make a 1 year growth in reading by June 2023 as measured by Oral Running Records as well as iReady ELA (approx. \$7200 unsure if rest of year or a whole year's amount)
